How it works: Community Distribution



- 1 Pregnant woman goes to her first ANC visit
- 2 She receives her pregnancy card and a net during her exam.
- 3 The RCH nurse marks her pregnancy card to indicate that she has received a net
- 4 She takes her net home and is protected during her pregnancy.

- 1 Caretaker brings child for 9 month measles vaccination
- 2 The RCH nurse gives the caretaker a net during the visit
- 3 The RCH nurse marks the child's health card to indicate that a net was given
- 4 The caretaker takes the net home and the child continues to be protected

- 1 A person with malaria goes to the clinic for testing and has a positive test
- 2 The ACD team visits the person's house to test the other members of the household for malaria.
- 3 During the visit the ACD team observes whether the household is using their nets, and if there are enough nets
- 4 If there are not enough nets, the ACD team gives the household a coupon to get a new net
- 5 The household exchanges the coupon for a new net at the nearest health facility

- 1 A person who needs a net seeks out their Sheha or selected assistant Shehas, who have been provided with coupons
- 2 The Sheha/assistant Sheha verifies that they meet the eligibility criteria (see next slide)
- 3 The household exchanges the coupon for a new net at the nearest health facility
